
UCAP May 2022 - December 2023: Overview



- To date UCAP, working with local partners, has supported 33 projects helping nearly 45,000 children and families cope with the impact of war including severe psychological trauma, prolonged educational disruption, health care concerns and urgent humanitarian needs.
- UCAP leadership including its regional director in Lviv, Ukraine stays in constant touch with local partners, via in-person visits and regular accountability reports from funded recipients.
- In addition to direct services for children and families, UCAP has worked with Ukraine's government and other organizations to establish initiatives that (1) sustain the U.S. public's interest in the plight of Ukraine's children via traditional and social media and (2) begin the process of planning for Ukraine's post-war recovery.
- UCAP has attracted more than 12,500 supporters, including many recurrent donors
- During this 20-month period, UCAP has raised \$4,002,110

Grant and Program Support





1) Education and Youth Programs



- School and Student Support in Ukraine
 - New Kids Club Enrichment Center built and opened Nov 2023 Lviv
 - School Buses delivered to Chernihiv
 - Interactive Whiteboards for Pilot Middle Schools Lviv
 - Audio Lab for Visually Impaired School Lviv
 - Computer Lab rebuilt in School Damaged by Missiles -Lviv
 - Computer Tablets for Displaced 5th Graders in Lviv Region
 - Ukrainian Camp in Lviv region for Displaced Children
 - Global Classroom collaboration between Ukraine Schools and US Schools

1) Education and Youth Programs (cont)

- Educational Support for Ukrainian Refugee Students
 - Ukrainian School and Camp in Budapest, Hungary
 - Ukrainian Weekend School in Warsaw, Poland
 - Ukrainian "Plast" (Scout) Camp and Community Centers in Krakow and Warsaw, Poland
 - Educational Support for Displaced Ukrainian College Bound Students (USA and Europe)
 - Partnership with Ministry of Education and Science in development of "We Are Ukraine" – an educational app for children in Ukraine and abroad that will be implemented as an interactive map of Ukraine, where the player travels by train and engages with Ukrainian history, language and culture challenges.



2) Addressing Child Trauma



- Recovery Camps for children and moms impacted by the war
 - 34 1-Day and 17 6-Day family camps with social, and psychological support
 - Children screened for PTSD, receive psychological support and referred for additional services, as needed
- Development of On-line Interactive Course on Trauma for Ukrainian Teachers
 - Currently hosted on websites of Dept of Education, Lviv City and Lviv Region
 - Also hosted on website of Ukrainian Teachers Union
 - Polish Version developed and hosted on Warsaw Dept of Education and Polish Teachers Union
 - Thousands of teachers have taken the course and received certificates

2) Addressing Child Trauma (cont)



- Support for Spilnota (Community) Program for Orphan Youth
 - Included Capital Support for Construction of Dormitory and Youth Center in Lviv, Ukraine
 - Also supported 1st year of newly developed comprehensive program for education, social skills and job opportunities
- Social Worker for refugee families in Prague, Czech Republic

3) Child Health Programs



- Pediatric Expert Exchange Program
 - Connecting Lviv St. Nicolas Children's Hospital with NYC Children's Hospital at Montefiore – to develop monthlong pediatric subspecialist "observerships" for 10 MDs and a series of virtual training seminars
- Support new Children's Mental Health Center at St. Nicolas Children's Hospital – providing computer technology and training and testing materials for psychologists and psychiatrists
- Development of "Hub and Spokes" telehealth system at Dnipro Children's Hospital to facilitate virtual pediatric subspecialty care for children in surrounding towns

4) Urgent Winter & Humanitarian Needs

- To Address Winter and the Lack of Electricity in Ukraine
 - 115 Wood-burning Stoves for Chernihiv
 - 160 Generators for Invincibility Community Centers Kyiv
 - Winter boots, clothing, food and holiday gifts for IDPs and Orphans
 - 50 Generators for Lviv Kindergartens, in collaboration with AFT
 - Large Generator for Recovery Camp
- Health care supplies and kits for families impacted by Kakhovka Dam flooding



5) Raising Awareness & Advocacy



- Supporting Ukraine Action Network (UAN)
 - Helping facilitate Clinton Global Initiative's UAN that brings together nonprofits focused on addressing needs in Ukraine. Helping develop shared recommendations to address educational and mental health needs now and for recovery
- Developed National Survey of Parents to assess issues and needs in order to promote US media awareness
- Supporting Future of Ukraine initiative (FOU)
 - Working with Columbia University's School for International Public Affairs and new Institute for Global Politics facilitate events and discussions to keep Ukraine issues in the media and public eye
