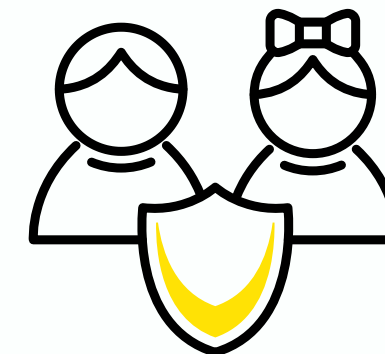
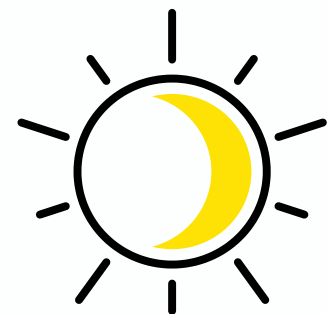


The “Children of Heroes” Charitable Foundation, together with UCAP, joined forces to provide warm jackets, shoes and NY Gifts for children who have lost one or both parents due to the war in Ukraine.

As part of this partnership, 150 jackets, 195 pairs of winter shoes, 222 gift certificates were distributed to children from the most vulnerable families facing difficult financial circumstances.

As of February 20, 2026, the “Children of Heroes” Charitable Foundation cares for over 15,560 children who have lost one or both parents as a result of the war in Ukraine.

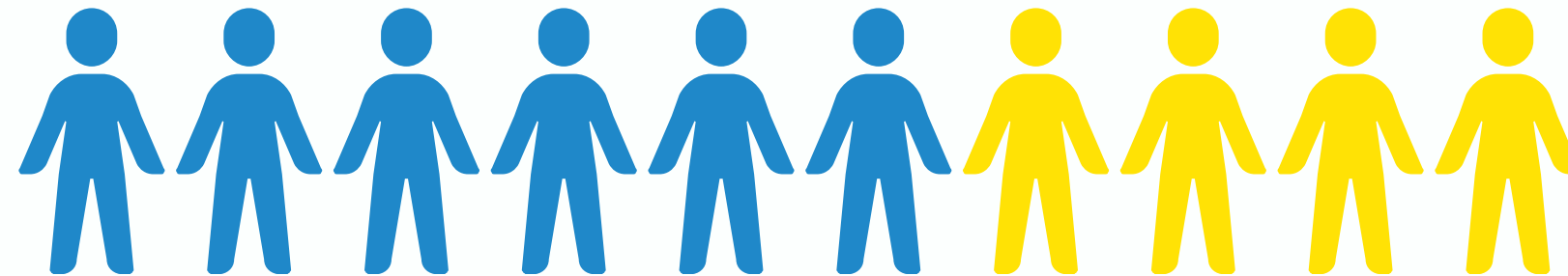

Who are the aid recipients

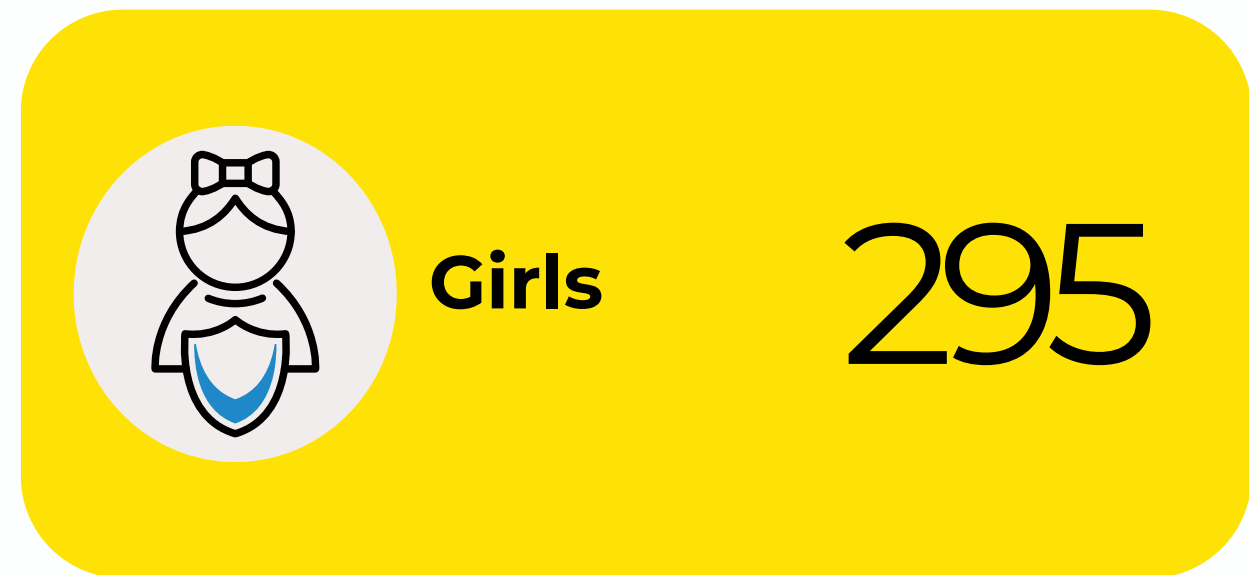
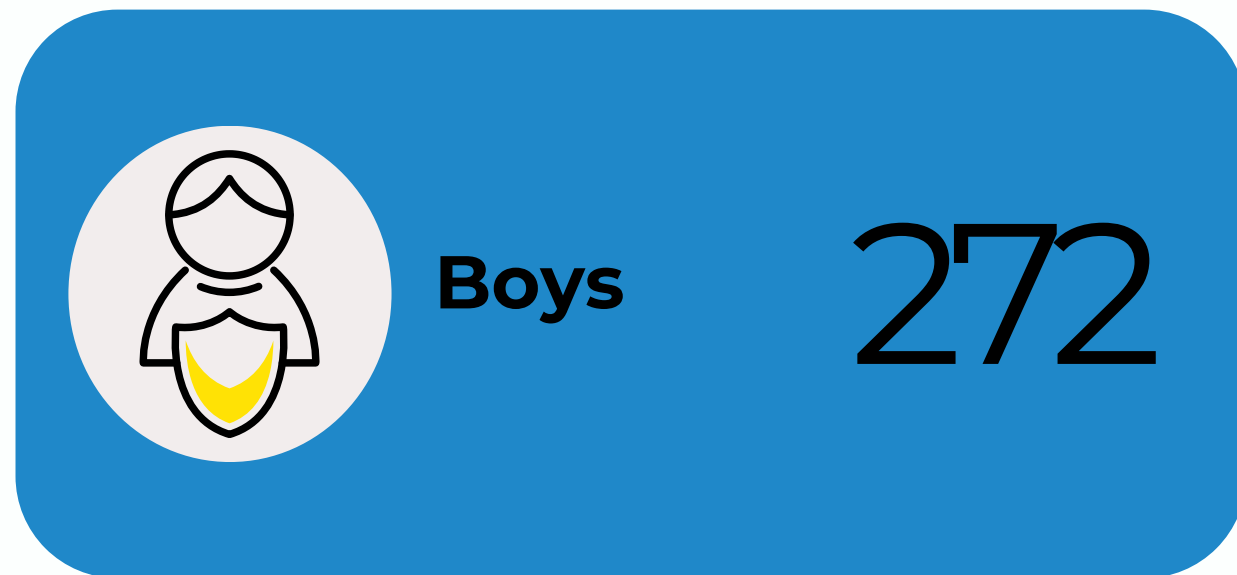

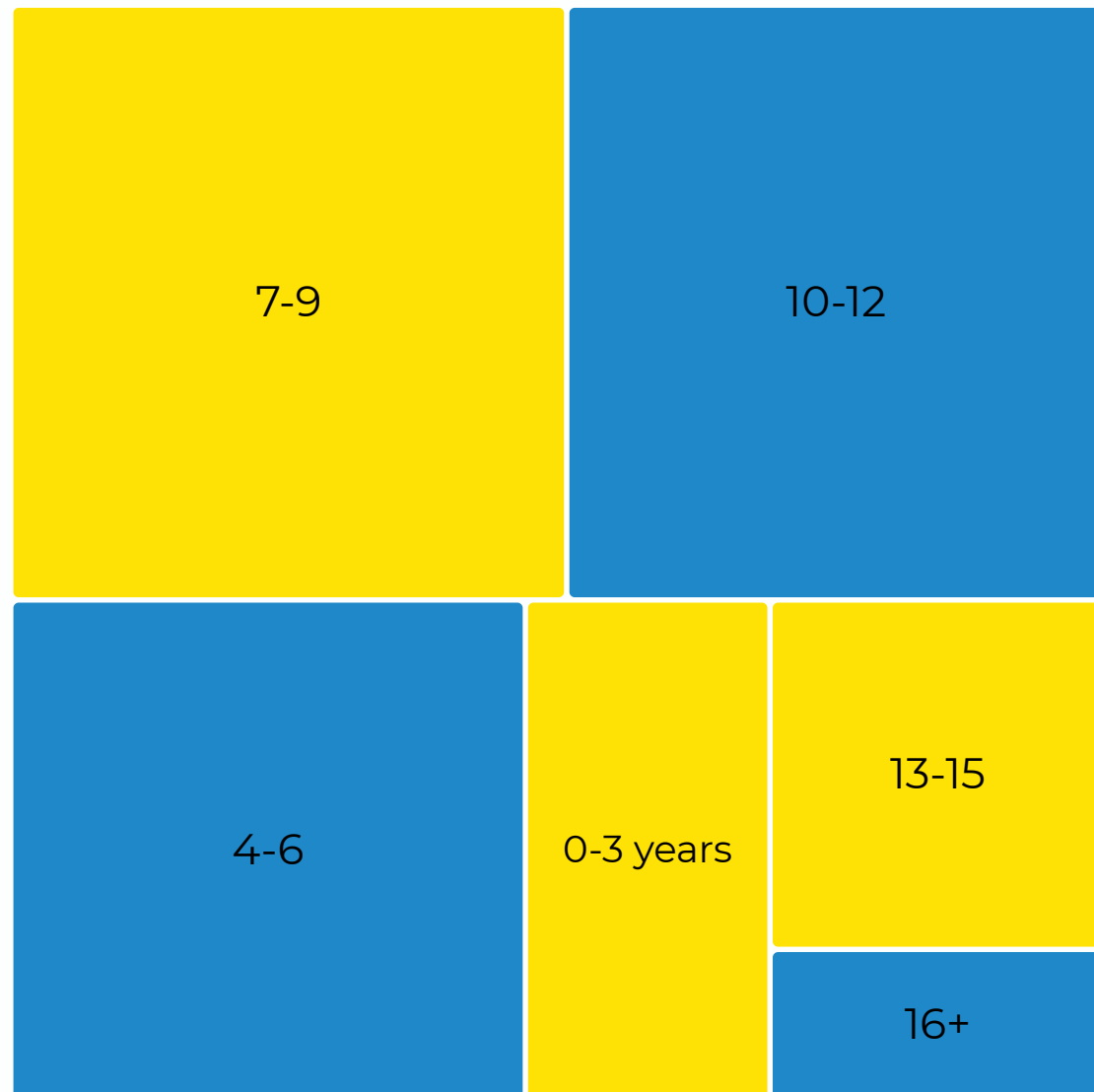
Who are the aid recipients

Distribution by children's age:

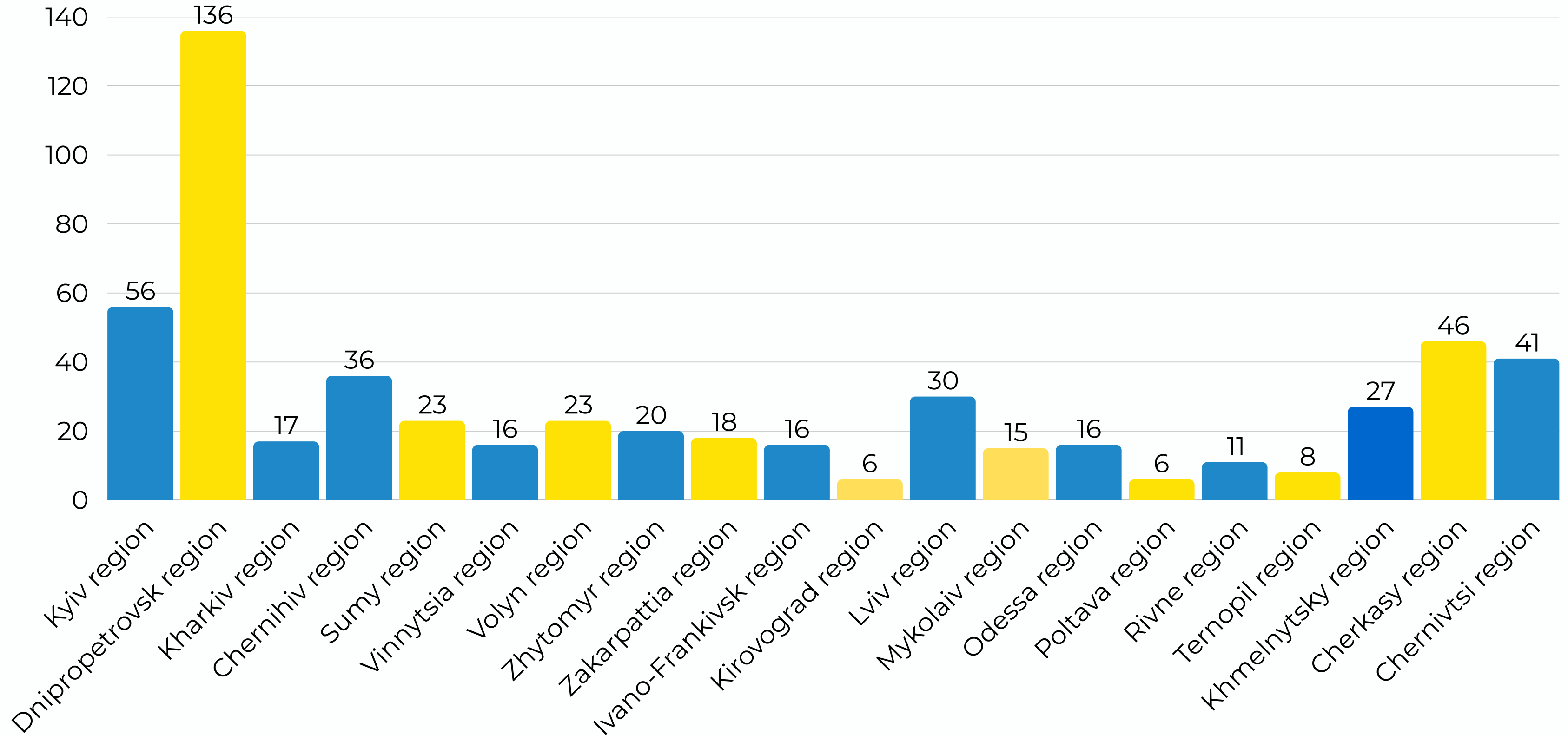


- 0-3 years - 60 children

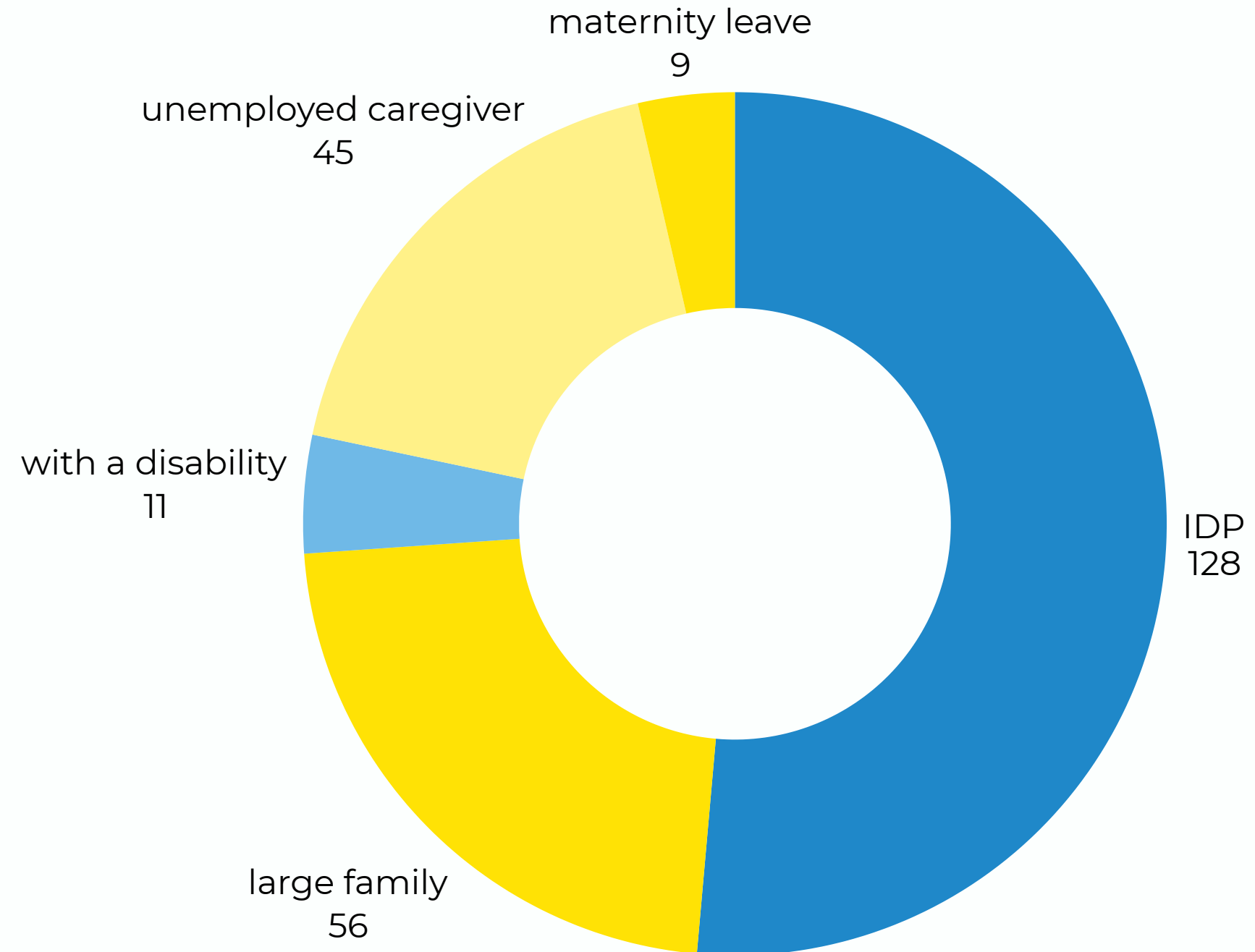
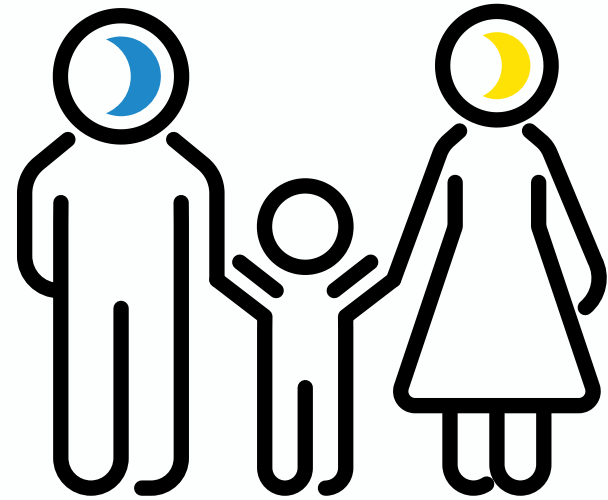


Distribution by region:



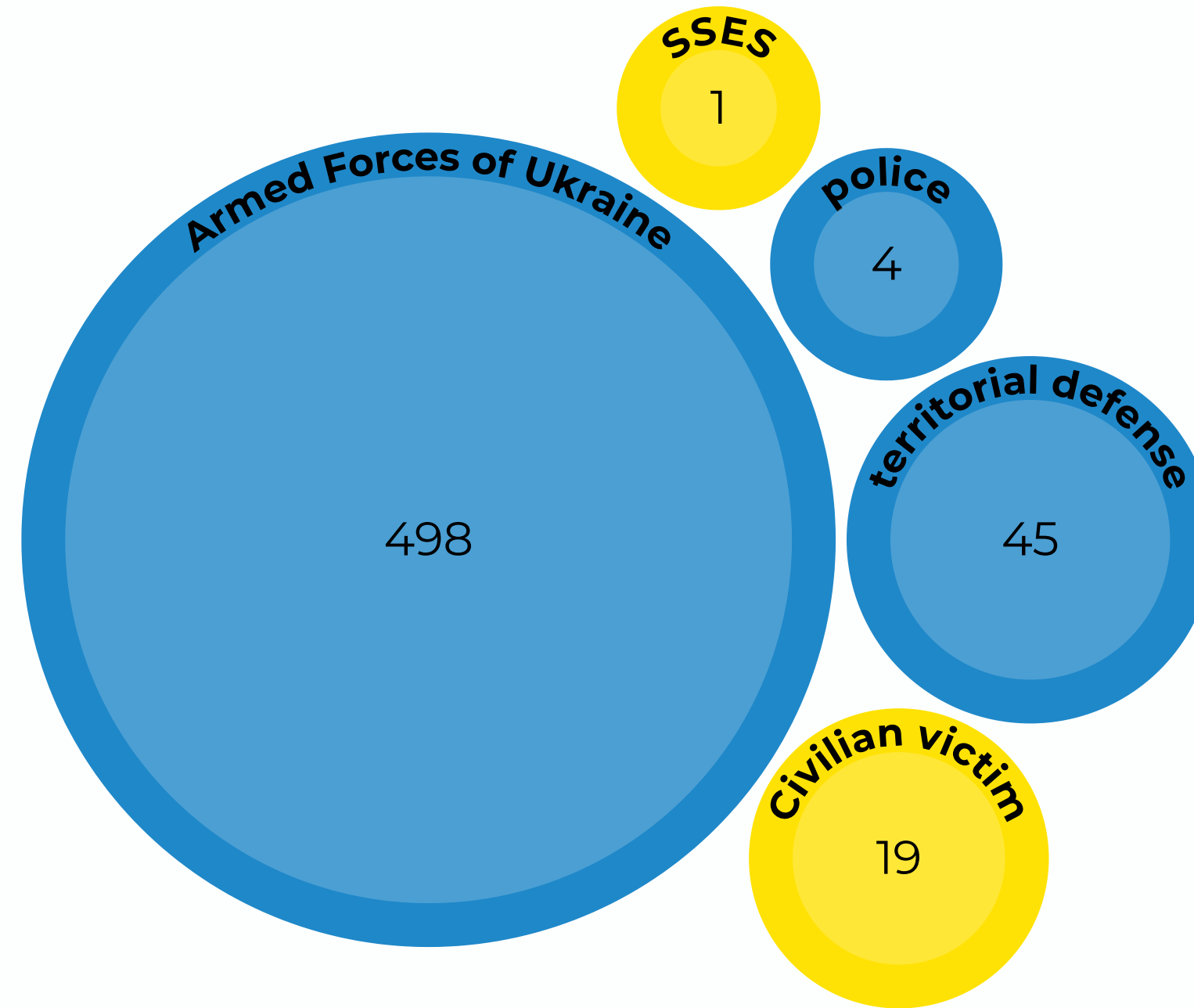

Angelika lost her father, who was killed while defending Ukraine. The family lives in the Chernihiv region and is in need of humanitarian support.

Yurii's father was a soldier who was killed in action while defending Ukraine. He lives with his mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother. The family does not have their own home.

Despite the difficult circumstances, his mother does everything she can to ensure Yurii continues to grow, learn, and feel supported.

Thanks to a winter clothing certificate, the family was able to purchase a warm jacket for Yurii. This support provides not only warmth during the winter, but also a sense of care and solidarity.

Impact story: Maxym Levchuk, 9 y.o.



Maksym's father went missing during a combat mission. For the family, this means living with daily uncertainty and hope.

Maksym studies English and attends swimming classes, which help him grow, stay active, and find joy in everyday life.

Thanks to a footwear certificate, Maksym was able to choose a pair of shoes he truly liked on his own. It was important for him to make his own choice and feel supported.
